We both worked in the recovery room, both loved animals, especially horses, and were equally frustrated with our chosen profession. I watched her struggle with her lung condition and was amazed how she was able to keep going despite the obvious hardship living with this disability had on her. I was saddened when she moved to S.C. but understood and knew deep down she would only be really happy near her family. She went with me when I picked up my wedding dress and I helped her pick out her horse trailer. I had the opportunity to visit her in Jackson a couple times and I wished it could have been more. Regardless of her breathing difficulties she was always up for an adventure. She attended the Parelli Tour stop with me in Harrisburg PA one year and really struggled with the walking, but at no time was stopping or giving up an option. I remember her watching Caton Parelli, Pat Parelli's disable son, do amazing things with horses and the tears just rolled down her cheeks. I think it gave her some hope and motivation. She was always saying I should bring my baby down and we could go riding. I am sorry that never happened. Debbie was a special person that gave to others hope and strength, but never realized how much she impacted other's lives. She will be missed.
