“ MY DEEPEST SYMPATHY FOR THE LOSS OF YOUR LOVE ONE IN DEATH. MAY I LEAVE YOU WITH A WORD OF COMFORT AND RELIEF AT THIS TIME OF GRIEF.

DEEP FEELINGS OF GRIEF AND SORROW WHEN A LOVED ONE DIES ARE NOT INCOMPATIBLE WITH STRONG FAITH IN GOD. GRIEF IS THE NORMAL AND NATURAL RESPONSE TO THE LOSS OF SOMEONE WE LOVE.

GRIEF CAN AFFECTUS IN VARIOUS WAYS, BUT FOR MAY THE OVERRIDING FEELINGS IS ONE OF INTENSE EMOTIONAL PAIN.

THE GOOD NEWS IS THAT RECOVERY IS POSSIBLE. HOWEVER, IT MAY TAKE SOME TIME. JUST AS A SEVERE PHYSICAL WOUND TAKES TIME TO HEAL, SO IT IS WITH BEREAVEMENT. RECOVERING FROM GRIEF MAY TAKE MONTHS, A FEW YEARS, OR EVEN LONGER. BUT THE ACUTE PAIN YOU FEEL IN THE BEGINNING WILL LESSEN IN TIME, AND LIFE WILL GRADUALLY SEEM LESS BLEAK AND MEANINGLESS.

IN THE MEANTIME, GRIEF IS SAID TO BE NECESSARY PART OF THE HEALING PROCESS AND OF LEARNING TO ADAPT TO THE NEW SITUATION. THERE IS AN EMPTY SPACE WHERE BEFORE THERE WAS A LIVING HUMAN. WE NEED TO ADJUST TO LIFE WITHOUT THAT PERSON. GRIEF MAY PROVIDE A NECESSARY EMOTIONAL RELEASE. OF COURSE, NOT EVERYONE GRIEVES IN EXACTLY THE SAME WAY. ONE THING, THOUGH, SEEMS TO HOLD TRUE: REPRESSING YOUR GRIEF CAN BE HAMFUL MENTALLY, EMOTIONALLY, AND PHYSICALLY. HOW, THEN, CAN YOU EXPRESS YOUR GRIEF IN HEALTHY WAYS? THE BIBLE CONTAINS SOME PRACTICAL ADVICE:
