



Fred Randolph "Randy" Cannon, Jr.

North Augusta, SC – Funeral Services for Mr. Fred Randolph “Randy” Cannon, Jr., 77, who entered into rest September 8, 2023, will be conducted Wednesday morning at 11 o’clock at Sweetwater Baptist Church with Dr. Paul W. Noe officiating. Interment will follow in the church cemetery. The family will receive friends at the church one hour prior to the service from 10 until 11 o’clock.

Randy was born August 26, 1946, raised in Miami, FL, and at the age of 13, he moved to Augusta, GA to live with his father. Randy was a veteran of the Army National Guard with 23 years of service, retiring as a First Sergeant. He also worked as a banker with C&S Bank for 12 years prior to serving as owner and operator of his construction company, Cannon Group Inc. Randy had a tremendous work ethic and enjoyed giving back to his community through his volunteer efforts. He had a passion for raising and breeding English Setters and had many beloved canine friends through the years, especially his dog, Bandit. Randy was an avid hunter in his younger years and loved quail hunting with his father, Fred Randolph “Ted” Cannon, Sr.

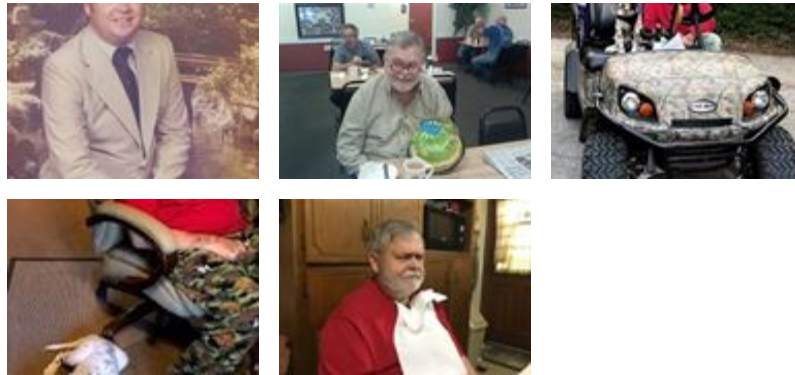
