



George Verdery Walden

October 16, 1952 - February 1, 2024

North Augusta, SC – Funeral Services for Mr. George Verdery Walden, 71, who entered into rest on February 1, 2024, will be conducted Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock at the Posey Funeral Home Chapel. Reverend Steve Davis officiating. The family will receive friends at the funeral home on Friday evening from 5 until 7.

Mr. Walden was born October 16, 1952, in Augusta, GA., to the late Leon Colquiett Walden and Frances Verdery Walden. He was a resident of North Augusta for 71 years and was a 1971 graduate of North Augusta High School. George attended Augusta College, and graduated apprenticeship school with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW 1579) as a Journeyman Electrician in 1974.

Employed at Savannah River Site most of his career as an Electrician and Quality Control Engineer, George traveled to work in the United Kingdom at Greenham Common Air Force Base, and he also worked at several locations in the United States including Washington D.C. where we did security installations for President Ronald Regan's presidential hangar for Air Force One as well as the Augusta National with CBS sports for the Masters tournament.

George enjoyed being a member of the North Augusta Demolays and singing

in the choir at First Baptist Church in North Augusta. In his later years he served alongside his wife as a greeter on Sunday mornings at True North Church where they were members.

Surviving family members are his wife of 45 years, Dale Boone Walden; a son Kevin Ryan Walden; a grandson, Kevin Ryan Walden II, and his wife Caitlyn Walden; a brother Leon Colquiett Walden Jr. (Vickie) and two sisters, Celeste Verdery Walden Spence (Wayne), and Juanita Walden Zachow (Dennis).

George was preceded in death by one brother, Ralph Malcolm Walden and one son, George Verdery Walden Jr.

When the ceremony was over and people went to the dance floor, he smiled as he reminisced about going dancing with Dale when they were younger. Never with sadness over days gone by, but with Joy for what he had been blessed with.

He was one of a kind. I really love my Uncle George.

Aunt Dale, Kevin and Ryan will go through so much grief, but I pray

that they'll also encounter waves of gratitude for being blessed enough to have had these years with such a special man. This man holds a special place in my heart and is an example of how genuine gentle kindness can impact generations to come. Thank you Uncle George.

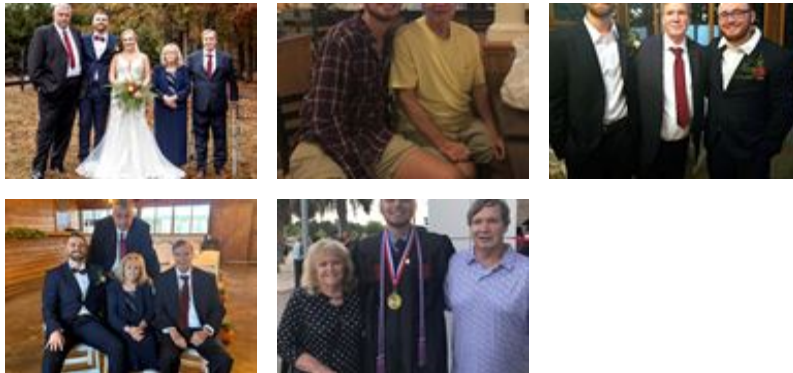
