



## Glenwood Woody Wooten

May 11, 1943 - December 10, 2025

North Augusta, SC - Glenwood Woody Wooten, 82, entered into rest on December 10, 2025, surrounded by the family he so deeply loved. A service honoring his life will be held Monday, December 15, 2025, at Noon at Oleander Memorial Gardens Mausoleum in Wilmington, NC.

Born May 11, 1943, in Edgecombe County, NC, to the late Glenwood and Earline Wooten, Mr. Wooten grew into a man defined by quiet strength, determination, and a brilliant, curious mind. After graduating North Carolina State University with a degree in mechanical engineering, he built a distinguished 37-year career in the paper manufacturing industry, retiring in 2002 as Director of Manufacturing Services. His achievements reflected not only his intellect and work ethic, but a profound sense of responsibility for the family and future he was determined to build.

Central to every chapter of his life was his wife of 63 years, Barbara. He depended on her steadfast support, her calm presence, and her unwavering devotion. She stood by him through every season, encouraging his ambitions, grounding him in love, and caring for him with extraordinary tenderness through his final days.

A lifelong learner, Mr. Wooten never stopped expanding his knowledge or pursuing new interests. In retirement, he immersed himself in the art of fly

tying, clockmaking, and any craft that sparked his curiosity. His passion for both learning and socializing with other enthusiasts led him to being a member of the Augusta Kayak Club, the Augusta Sailing Club, local sporting clay club, and local fly-fishing circles.

His love of the outdoors shaped many of his most joyful moments. Whether camping with the family, sailing along the coast, kayaking down the Savannah River, or casting a line on one of his many fishing trips to Alaska with friends, he found peace and excitement in nature. An avid traveler, he never hesitated exploring and photographing new landscapes, studying new craftsmanship, and tasting new cuisines – his absolute favorite.

Above all, Mr. Wooten was a family man. He held immense pride in the life he and Barbara created and took joy in every child, grandchild, and great-grandchild. He celebrated their achievements, supported their dreams, and offered wisdom and steadiness whenever needed. His kind, loyal, and quietly confident presence will be deeply missed.

He is survived by his devoted wife, Barbara Smith Wooten; daughters Laurie Wooten Seitter (Ray) and Karen Wooten Proctor (Lee); grandchildren Ashley Benbow (Matt), Kelsey Seitter, Tessa Rivenbark (Patrick), Michaela Seitter (Steve), Joshua Seitter, Samantha Seitter, Tyler Proctor (Macy), and Justin Proctor; and great-grandchildren Braylee, Thomas, and Daley. He is also survived by his sister Lynette Sumerlin (Jerry) and brother Michael Wooten.
