“ My Uncle Harold was a gentlemen. I never heard him gripe, never complain. Back in the 60's and 70's during Thanksgiving time my family (all 7 of us) and my grandparents (the 2 of them) would head to North Augusta. "Descend onto him" would be a better phrase. For the truth of it is we were all his 'in-laws'. We were related in blood to his wife Betty Thompson. All of a sudden he would have a big, loud crowd in his house from his wife's family for a week. Never a complaint, always gracious. I am not sure how he did that.

The man was always very kind ot me. Whenever we would talk about something mechanical or even about life things he was always positive. But he was also a bit of a teacher. He would start out the conversation with "you see the way this works is ...". And then we would just absorb that. But, no lectures, no talking down.

As a child, when you were in his orbit it was just that. You could approach him and ask about almost anything. And he would take the time. Very patient. He had a way of just being a great uncle. We were not quite his kids - and that was properly so - but he cared about us and we felt it. And I thank him for that.

Uncle Harold, Aunt Betty and the rest of the Thompson clan came up to Virginia for my Dad's funeral in 2005. Afterwards we went to a restaurant. Towards the end we were all getting ready to go our separate ways. Uncle Harold walked up to me and put out his hand. He said, "Rob, I am not sure if we are going to see each other again but ...." and then someone walked right up and interrupted us. The moment was lost. I guess the rest of this conversation will have to wait, if only I can live up to his standards and end up in the same place.

I wish very much I could be there tomorrow. Of course, my thoughts and prayers are with Joni and her family and David and his.
