She had a regular Stammtisch that met for many years. Lina filled her personal time with busy hands. She enjoyed baking especially during the holidays. Some will remember the clothing she sewed and that knitting needles were almost always in her hands.

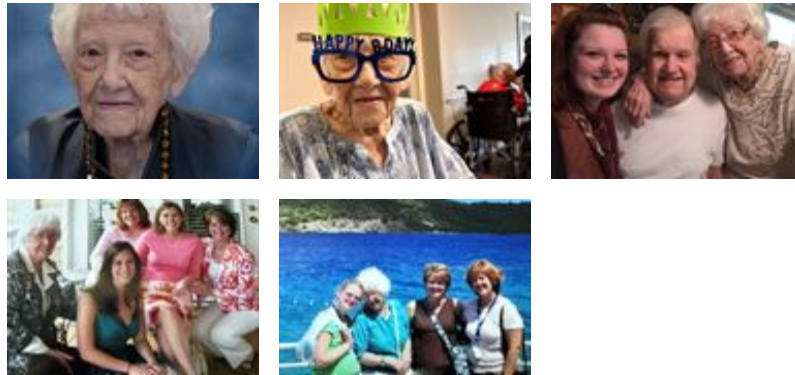
