“ I have known Marc for 29 years. We both attended the U.S. Army, Fort Devens, MA Electronic Warfare Interceptor System Repairman Course in 1980. I worked for him when he was the Commanding Officer of the 158th Intelligence Electronic Warfare Direct Support Maintenance Detachment Fort Bragg, NC, and he worked with me as a good friend and colleague; one of the finest Site Managers I have had the distinction to know. Marc was a caring, thoughtful and giving person who lived each day to its full potential. He had a profound sense of pride in his work and patriotism to our Country. Marc made a difference; he served 20 years in the U.S. Army, and over 8 years as a defense contractor protecting our nation from foreign enemies and terrorists.
