Naomi was born in Columbia, SC on March 1, 1930. She grew up there & graduated from Olympia High School on June 9, 1949. While attending High School, she was on the Basketball Team; Cheerleader; Student Council; Glee Club & honored into the National Glee Club; Dramatics Club; Debater's Club Secretary; Soloist (Singer); Also Sang in a Band; Beta Club Secretary; Journalism Club; Editor of Olympian Newsletter; Assistant Business Manager of the Olympian Yearbook; Marshal; Chairman of the Finance Committee; Coronation Lady-in-Waiting; Voted Best All-Round; Best Disposition; Most Entertaining; & Friendliest at Olympia High.

After graduating, Naomi worked for Southern Bell (now AT&T), as a switchboard operator & later advanced to Southern Bell Accounting in Columbia, SC. While in Belvedere, SC, she was employed at DuPont at SRS in Aiken, SC, until she started their family. Later in her life, in North Augusta, SC, she was employed at Summerfield Annex Elementary School for 20 years, as the school secretary. But she really took the job, to be near the children she adored & to mentor them & make a difference in their lives. She loved her job so very much & all her co-workers & being in a school environment, assisting the teachers & the principal & especially all the of the children. Her eyes & spirit would always sparkle with joy around any children in her presence. She took care of all of her grandchildren & enjoyed every moment. A gift from God!

While living in Columbia, SC, she met Vincent Walker, after he had returned from Japan, where he was stationed, after his service in the US Army during the Korean War. He was transferred & stationed later to Fort Jackson in Columbia, SC, as a Sergeant in the US Army. He met Naomi for the first time with his Army pal & was his best friend, R.E Rosenzweig of Miami, FL. After Vince met Naomi, on that same special first day, he told his Army pal, that he was going to marry Naomi? It was Love at first sight! There first date was on Valentine's Day on February 14, 1952. He came to the front door bearing a dozen red roses & a wrapped gift. They went out to dinner & then later, he had her unwrap the other gift & it was a Cookbook & he said his mother was an awful cook! Love his humor! & Paul McMahon was the Soloist. Their Best Man was the Army pal, whom Vince had told that first day they met, that he was going to marry her? Vincent was true to his words! They honeymooned in Canada at Niagara Falls. They were married for almost 60 years, as Vincent went to Heaven to be with his Savior in 2011, after a long battle with Alzheimers. We all miss him so very much & all loved him dearly, as he gave us all so many special memories to cherish for a lifetime & so much love, and so much fun, too. He was an only child & delighted in having 3 children & especially grandchildren.

Vincent was offered employment with DuPont at SRS in Aiken, SC, as a chemical engineer, so they moved to Belvedere, SC & resided there for many years & started their family. They outgrew their home, so moved to their new home in North Augusta, SC & have since been life-long residents. They were loyal members of the Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in North Augusta, SC. Naomi always adored all of her Church Family & sang in the choir & taught Sunday School & Vacation Bible School. She loved everyone in the congregation & always enjoyed the fellowship after church on Sundays. She especially loved the Lutheran Woman, that all met together once a month & she always looked forward to being together with her church girlfriends. Naomi was a devoted Christian, who loved to spread the joy of the Lord & was a steadfast believer in the Holy Bible.

Naomi & the family & friends enjoyed boating days on the weekends at Clarks Hill Lake, SC & especially during the Summer. She loved to slalom water-ski. Vince built a workshop in the backyard in Belvedere, SC, so he could build his first leisure boat for water-skiing, etc. Vince built hydroplane boats & was on a racing team & built & flew remote control model airplanes in a club & built furniture for our home & built an amazing stereo system into a large wooden credenza he built for our living room, so all the family & friends could sing &

dance together. Naomi & Vince were both avid Bridge players & loved playing Bridge together with couples on Friday nights. Loved camping vacations in our travel trailer at Hunting Beach State Park, SC & other locations in the USA. They included regular trips to Hilton Head Island, SC to their vacation villa to socialize, play bridge & meet many new-found friends. Naomi was in a Bowling League, Golf League, Bridge Club & Garden Club with all her lady friends & enjoyed & loved all of those friendships & the longevity of all their years together. She loved lighthouses & had an amazing collection & also photographed many on her travel adventures.

Naomi also enjoyed dancing; (Jitterbug, Swing, Foxtrot, Twist, (Thanks to Elvis); music; (Big Band, Jazz, Rock'n'Roll); photography, writing, flower arranging & sewing & was an awesome seamstress. Naomi & Vince were both avid world travelers & enjoyed many vacations with family & friends (Australia & the Orient, etc.) & cruising the high seas, Alaska & Europe, were favorites amongst many! She was a loyal supporter & fan of the SC Gamecocks & the Atlanta Braves & all of our family loved Golf the most, especially during Masters Week every year in Augusta, GA, the Best Golf Tournament Ever!! She was a big fan of Arnold Palmer (Arnie's Army), Gary Player & Jack Nicholas & Tiger Woods!

Naomi found the simple pleasures of life with her caring & kind heart & warm personality. She lived her life to the fullest, filled with lots of laughter & lasting memories with family & friends & all their great times together. She had a heart of gold & loved everybody & everything! Her lovely smile was contagious with her beautiful blue eyes. Her unwavering faith in God guided her every step & her infectious humor brightened the lives of those around her with her kind compassionate & caring nature. Naomi found solace & strength in her relationship with the Lord & she was comforted in God's loving embrace of life with a spirit of gratitude & laughter.
