Mr. Barnett was a native of Oklahoma, having made Jackson his home for the past 60 years. He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Jackson where he served as a Deacon and was active in various church responsibilities. Mr. Barnett was retired from Westinghouse at the Savannah River Site, a former member of the Aiken County Board of Education Advisory Board and a former girls softball coach. He was the son of the late Mr. A.J. Barnett.
