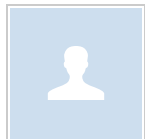

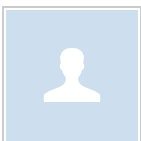

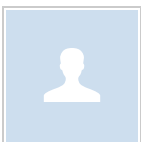


“ To the family of Mr. Bean:
