Samantha was a native of Maryland, having made North Augusta her home for the past 10 years. She was a member of St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church and granddaughter of the late Donald Glavach. Samantha was a 2006 International Baccalaureate graduate of North Augusta High School and a 2010 Magna-Cum Laude graduate of Clemson University with a degree in Physics. At Clemson University she was a Dixson Fellow, a graduate of Calhoun Honors College, President of the Society of Physics Students and a member of Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society.

Survivors include her parents, John and Janine Cawthorne; a brother, Zachary William Cawthorne; a sister, Rebecca Anne Cawthorne, all of North Augusta; paternal grandparents, Judith Carter and Emery Hill and John and Bonnie Cawthorne, all of Maryland; maternal grandmother, Susan Glavach, Myrtle Beach, SC; several aunts and uncles.

The family will receive friends at the funeral home Wednesday evening from 6 until 8.

Our Dixon Fellows group was by far one of the best experiences I had during my college career. The biggest reason was the chemistry of the group. Everyone in the group came from very different backgrounds, were incredibly intelligent and we all soon became friends.

I remember the Dixon Fellows meeting where I first met Sam. We were discussing the work of Paul Celan, a Romanian poet. The discussion went a little long and it eventually trickled outside to some tables at the coffee shop. I remember Sam was late—she had class that night run over. She ran up to the tables, sat down and proceeded to string off a list of questions and insights she had about the poem—never missing a beat. I remember being amazed that she could just jump right into the discussion and bring all these really interesting points up, even when she had been running late. I soon learned that was Sam.

I will never be able to pick up a text by Jose Luis Borges without thinking of Sam. I remember once I was telling Fivos, a physics professor, about Borges and how much he had to read him. A few days later I brought one of the books to his office and he told me that Sam had already given him the collected fictions. It was amazing to listen to Sam talk about Borges. Even at the mention of him, her face would light up and she would start rattling off the stories she liked and why.

I remember she and I laughing because we were the odd people out at one of the Dixon Fellows receptions at the President’s house last year because we did not live in Holmes our freshman year...laughing at ourselves for being the only moderately normal people there.

Sam was a wonderful person and I treasure the two years I had in the group with her. I will always remember her infectious smile,

slowly growing from the corners of her mouth and filling up the room. No matter how dark the topic, she could warm the room with her smile.

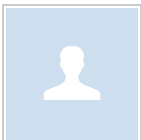

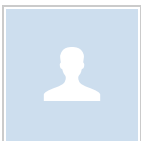

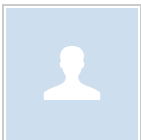
