



Stanley L. Bryant

December 21, 1943 - March 23, 2020

North Augusta, SC- Mr. Stanley L. Bryant, 76, entered into rest March 23, 2020, at home surrounded by his loving family. Due to the extraordinary circumstances associated with COVID-19, a Private Family Graveside Service will be conducted in Pineview Memorial Gardens. A Public Memorial Service will be announced at a later date.

Mr. Bryant was a lifelong resident of North Augusta. He was a member of the Sweetwater Baptist Church and a former member of the First Baptist Church of North Augusta where he served as a Deacon, Sunday School Teacher and Director of the Ushers. Mr. Bryant was a US Army Veteran of Vietnam serving with the 319th Transportation Company. He was retired from the General Electric Company and a member of the Jesse C. Lynch Memorial American Legion Post #71.

Survivors include his wife of 50 years, Connie C. Bryant; a daughter, Beth (Charles) Barranco, Aiken; a son, Charles L. Bryant, Myrtle Beach, SC; a grandson, Connor Matthew Rappeno; and beloved GoldenDoodle, Tucker.

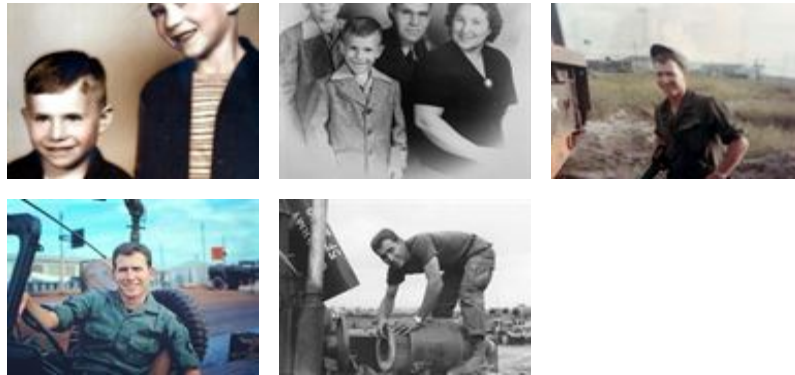

“ Since I cannot visit with the family I wanted to reminisce a little. Stan was one of the first persons I met when the family moved to North Augusta in 1991. Stan's friendly smile and personality made it easy for Cindy and I to share life with him & Connie. When I was asked to help usher at First Baptist, Stan was the balcony boss and always had a note pad in his inside coat pocket which he checked usher attendance but I always kidded him that he was assigning demerits which did not result in telling me to go sit in a pew but added months to my usher volunteer commitment.

For several years Stan organized a color guard of veterans to present the colors when requested by church staff. Sergeant Major Stan, in uniform, would be there Sunday AM with the Army Field Manual 3-21.5 Drill & Ceremonies to make sure we did not improvise any of our movements and always made sure the American flag was treated with utmost respect. My alma mater, The Citadel, would have been proud.

One Sunday I had a lesson to teach that focused on the less fortunate in the community and in walks Stan with a homeless man, Brooks, and sat on the front row of my classroom. It took me a just a little while to realize that Stan was not pulling my leg but was just being Stan and caring for others. The class helped this man for a period of time until he passed away and Stan coordinated a lot of those efforts.

I have had many laughs with Stan, as most of his friends did, but one that stands out in my mind in recent years was when he bought a camper after he was fighting pancreatic cancer. I went with him to pick it up and we arrived on Bolin Road just as school was getting out and he asked me to back it in since he was having difficulty with his left eye vision. He and I both laughed at all the “friendly “ hand sign gestures and "encouraging" advice I received as I blocked Bolin Road and slowly backed it into his driveway. I think Stan had this figured out before he put me behind the wheel. Gonna miss him but look forward to sharing stories and laughs in eternity.

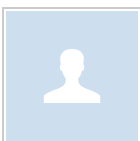

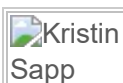

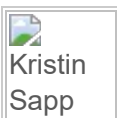
