Richmond, KY—Memorial Services for Dr. William M. Coleman, 77, who entered into rest November 28, 2014, will be conducted Saturday, December 13, 2014 at 3:30 in the First Presbyterian Church of Richmond, Kentucky. Dr. Coleman was a native of Tifton, Georgia, a longtime resident of Albany Georgia, Columbia, South Carolina and Beaufort, South Carolina, having made Richmond, Kentucky his home for the past several months. He served in the United States Army for thirteen years, having received the rank of Colonel. Dr. Coleman was a former member of the Lutheran Church of our Savior, Albany, Georgia and a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Richmond, Kentucky. In 1959 he graduated from Emory University and later graduated from the Medical College of Georgia in 1964. Dr. Coleman touched many young men's lives while serving as Scoutmaster in Albany, GA. He was preceded in death by his wife, Marcia Hair Coleman and a daughter, Jennifer Leigh Coleman.
